All domestic canines and felines entering the Argentine Republic must present an International Veterinary Certificate (CVI) issued by the Veterinary Authority of the country of origin that contains the sanitary requirements of Argentina (Resolution GMC 17/15). One of the languages of the CVI must be Spanish.

Senasa authorizes the entry of animals with a Passport that replaces the CVI, provided that it is in force, that contains the health information required by Resolution GMC 17/15 and that is endorsed or validated by signature and stamp of the Veterinary Authority of that country prior to the transfer.

The CVI or passport issued by the health authority of the country in which the dog / cat is located is valid for 60 (sixty) days to enter Argentina, and it must contain:

- Current rabies vaccine.
- Treatment against internal and external parasites within fifteen (15) days prior to the date of issuance of the CVI or the validation of the Passport.
- Medical review within 10 days prior to the issuance of the CVI or validation of the passport.
